



## CIVIL AVIATION SAFETY AUTHORITY OF PAPUA NEW GUINEA

Instrument Number: 20/EXE/01

### Exemption from the Requirements in Civil Aviation Rule CAR 61, 63, 65, 66, 121, 125, 135 and 136

PURSUANT TO Section 79(1) of the *Civil Aviation Act 2000* (as amended)

I, **WILSON SAGATI, OBE**, Director of Civil Aviation, being satisfied that-

- (a) the Papua New Guinea Government's restrictions in response to the threat of the spread of the virus COVID-19, in particular the State of Emergency in place from Tuesday 24 March 2020, are an event that make the prescribed requirements to renew Papua New Guinea licences and ratings as unreasonable in this particular case; and
- (a) the risk to safety will not be significantly increased by the granting of this exemption,

#### HEREBY EXEMPT—

Persons who:

- (1) are required by Civil Aviation Rule Parts 61, 63, 65, 66, 121, 125, 135 and 136 to maintain currency of their licences, certificates and ratings including those operating overseas under foreign authority validation; and
- (2) Have a flight review, proficiency check or rating that expires between 24 March 2020 and 30 June 2020

and other such rule parts prescribing the currency requirements for  
licences, ratings and operational competency,

**FOR A PERIOD OF—**

3 months from the original date of expiry of the licence, rating, certificate or operational competency review, within which period the privileges of that licence, rating or operational competency review may continue to be exercised

This exemption applies automatically; there is no application required. If the COVID-19 State of Emergency restrictions are extended, consideration will be given to a further exemption at that time.

This exemption will continue to apply to individuals where the end date of the 3-month period referred to above is later than the cessation of COVID-19 State of Emergency restrictions.
